The aim that we establish the BPPU

In order to step-down the military Junta, to get democracy and human rights, and to build a genuine federal state in future, we've established our union with students, workers and multicolour politicians those who have been trying to abolish military rule from 1962 up until now. All of them are expolitical prisoners and strongly wish to do political prisoners and strongly wish to do political activities against military regime.

Political Objectives of the BPPU

The principles of the BPPU

Thousands of democracy and human rights activities have been arrested, tortured and imprisoned for their peaceful activities. As the ruling military regime is illegitimate, all people in have lost their rights.

Above the reason, we have planned strategic aim and activities.

1. To press down heavily on the military regime in order to release political prisoners,

- 2. To raise awareness about political prisoners those who have been oppressed by SPDC from international community and to take strongly action on SPDC by UNSC.
- 3. To perform to be accepted a genuine discussion by SPDC for national reconciliation,
- 4. To perform thriving on a genuine federal state which all nationalities can possess equality from, and
- 5. To support the defensive war of ethnic nationalities and democatic forces on SPDC.
